We Are All Special

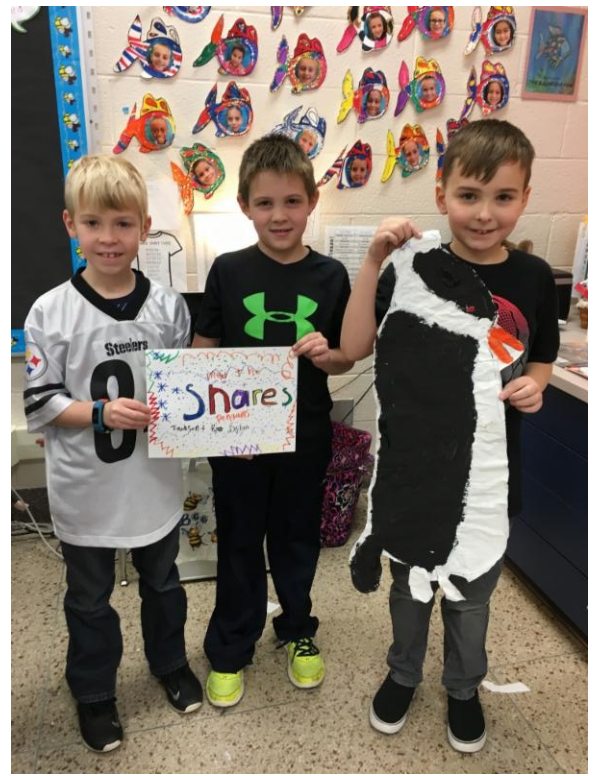
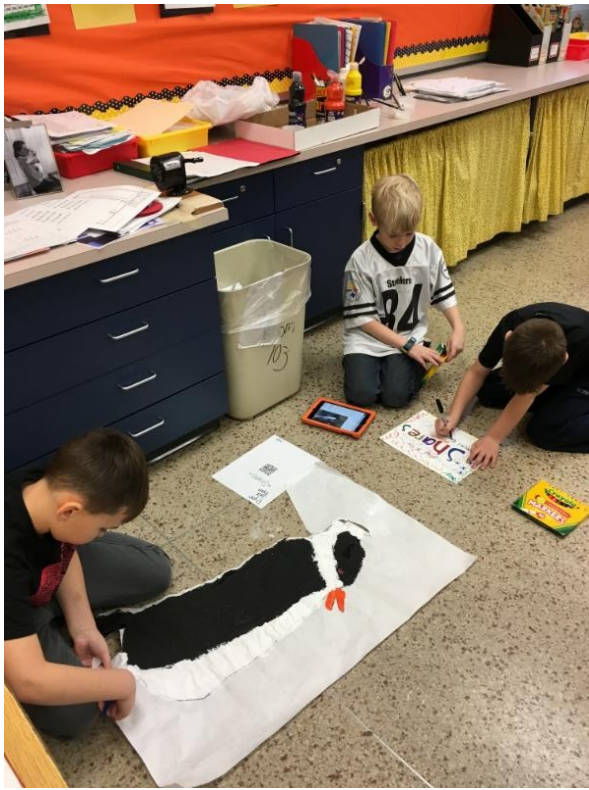

Family Access

Be sure to set up your Skyward Account and update your Emergency Contact Info. Here are the directions if you have not set up your account.

SETTING UP YOUR FAMILY ACCESS CENTER ACCOUNT

- 1) You will receive an email at the address we have on file for you. The email will come from do_not_reply@cysd.k12.pa.us and the subject will be "Family Access Account Information."
- 2) The email will contain a link that you will be asked to click on to reset your password. This is a security measure that allows you to control your email address and password settings. Enter your email address and click submit.
- 3) You will receive a message telling you that an email has been sent to you. Go to your email and open the message. It will be from do_not_reply@cysd.k12.pa.us and the subject will be "Forgotten Login/ Password Assistance."
- 4) The email will contain your Family Access User Name and a link to set up your password. Click the link and you will see a new screen where you can enter and confirm your password.
- 5) Once you have completed this step, you will be directed to a main Log In screen for Skyward. If you are not redirected, go to <http://skyward.centralyork.org>. Enter your user name and password in the fields provided and click the "Sign In" button beneath those fields to enter the secure Family Access Center Portal.

****If you do not receive an email go to the CYS D website, www.cysd.k12.pa.us, and click on the "Skyward Family Access Center" button on the homepage.**

FOOD SERVICES INFORMATION/BALANCES

All balances active under "My School Bucks" were transferred to Skyward. Once you log in to your Family Access Center account, you will be able to view your child's cafeteria account and balances. You will also be able to add money to the account electronically through Skyward and RevTrak. The fee to use this service is a percentage of the sale, not a flat rate. Families may still send payments directly to school to avoid the online service charge.

Please note the following items related to Food Services features in the Skyward.

- Links to the the Free and Reduced Meal Application for 2016-2017 & School Cafeteria Menus are available under the "District Links" tab in Skyward.
- Parents/guardians can limit purchases to meals only in the Family Access Center.
- Parents/guardians can limit a la carte purchases to a certain dollar amount in Family Access Center.
- Parents can view lunch balances and purchase activity in Family Access Center.
